Subject: FLASH FLOOD ADVISORY

Dear Sir,

I am directed to enclose herewith the Alert no. A-02/2026 dated 31st March, 2026 received from Chief Meteorologist FFD, Lahore on the subject noted above wherein it is intimated that according to the latest meteorological conditions, another strong westerly weather system is expected to affect **Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Karak, Hangu, Kohat, Orakzai, Kurram, Khyber, Peshawar, Nowshera, Charsadda, Mohmand, Malakand, Mardan, Swabi, Bajaur, Dir (Upper & Lower), Buner, Shangla, Swat, Chitral (Upper & Lower), DI Khan, Haripur, Abbottabad, Mansehra, Battagram and Kohistan (Upper, Lower & Kolai Pallas)** from 2nd to 4th April.

Consequently, from 2nd to 4th April, there is a likelihood of **flash flooding in the associated tributaries of River Kabul, Kohat Toi, Kurram and Gomal.**

Furthermore, **water levels in the River Kabul and its tributaries** are also expected to increase significantly.

It is therefore requested to kindly take all precautionary measures to avoid any loss of life, damages to infrastructure/ crops and animals. Furthermore, all concerned authorities may be requested to take the following safety measures:

- a) **Identification of vulnerable points / at-risk communities and devise mitigation and safety measures.**
- b) **Maintain enhanced alert level / monitoring of developing situation to reduce reaction / response times.**
- c) **Rescue 1122 & Civil Defence to remain alert and ensure availability of personnel and equipment during the forecast period, especially in at-risk areas.**
- d) **People living along the banks of River Kabul, Kohat Toi, Kurram and Gomal and its associated Nullahs to be sensitized about expected flash flooding/ increase of water flows.**
- e) **Timely evacuation of at-risk population from low-lying / flood prone areas as per Evacuation Plans and availability of shelter, food and medicines in those shelter camps.**
- f) **Locals / farmers / cattle herders be forewarned to shift cattle away from low lying areas adjacent to River Kabul and its associated Nullahs.**
- g) **Restrict vehicle movement in low lying / at-risk areas, close to River Kabul and its associated water channels / nullahs.**
- h) **Provision of relief / medical supplies to affectees in timely manner.**
- i) **Coordinate with concerned departments for clearance of roads in case of any blockage / obstruction, waterlogging and pre-placing of necessary emergency equipment at vulnerable / appropriate locations.**
- j) **In case of any occurrence, updates may kindly be shared with PEOC, PDMA on 6th hours basis**
- k) **PEOC, PDMA is active round the clock via toll helpline 1700 for any guidance and help**

Flash Flood Advisory

According to the latest meteorological conditions, another strong westerly weather system is expected to affect **North Balochistan** (Zhob, Qilla Saifullah, Harnai, Kalat, Musa Khel, Sherani, Loralai, Barkhan, Kachhi, Ziarat, Kohlu, Mastung and Sibi districts), **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa** (Bannu, Lakki Marwat, Karak, Hangu, Kohat, Orakzai, Kurram, Khyber, Peshawar, Nowshera, Charsadda, Mohmand, Malakand, Mardan, Swabi, Bajaur, Dir (Lower & Upper), Buner, Shangla, Swat, Chitral, Haripur, Abbottabad, Mansehra, Batagram and Kohistan districts.), **South Punjab** (Hill torrent areas of D.G. Khan and Rajanpur districts), **Gilgit Baltistan** (Diamir, Ghizer, Tangir Darel) and **Kashmir** (Neelam, Muzaffarabad, Hattian Bala & Bagh districts) from 2nd to 4th April.

Consequently, from 2nd to 4th April, there is a likelihood of flash flooding in the associated tributaries of the Rivers Kabul, Kohat Toi, Kurram and Gomal.

Additionally, nullahs originating from the hill torrents of Dera Ghazi Khan and Rajanpur districts are expected to experience flash flooding along with elevated flows. Water levels in the River Kabul and its tributaries are also expected to increase significantly. Nullahs in Gilgit-Baltistan and Kashmir are also expected to experience flash flooding.

Concerned authorities are advised to remain vigilant and take necessary precautionary measures. Residents of vulnerable and low-lying areas, particularly those near streams and nullahs, should remain vigilant and avoid unnecessary movement during the forecast period.
