Subject: **RAIN-WIND/THUNDERSTORM (WITH ISOLATED HAILSTORM) PREDICTED IN THE PROVINCE FROM 25TH (EVENING/ NIGHT) TO 30TH MARCH WITH OCCASIONAL GAPS**

Dear Sir,

I am directed to refer to the subject noted above and to state that Pakistan Meteorological Department, Regional Weather Forecasting Centre, Peshawar has predicted that a western disturbance is likely to approach southwestern parts of province on **24th (evening/night)** and likely to intensify from **27th night and may persist till 31st March.**

Under the influence of this weather system:

- **Rain-wind/thunderstorm with few heavy falls (snowfall over the hills)** is expected in Chitral (Upper & Lower), Dir (Upper & Lower), Swat, Shangla, Kohistan (Upper & Lower), Kolai-Pallas, Buner, Malakand, Battagram, Torghar, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Haripur, Mohmand, Bajaur, Mardan, Swabi, Khyber, Peshawar, Charsadda, Nowshera, Kohat, Kurram, Hangu, Orakzai, Karak, Bannu, Lakki Marwat, North Waziristan, South Waziristan (Upper & Lower), DI Khan and Tank from **25th (evening/night) to 26th March (morning)** and **widespread rain-wind/ thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls (snowfall over the hills)** from **28th to 30th March.**
- **Hailstorm** is also likely at isolated places during the period.

Possible Impacts:

- **Landslides** may occur in vulnerable areas of the province during the forecast period.
- **Due to heavy rains, Flash flood** is expected in local stream and nullahs of the province from 28th to 30th March
- **Windstorm/ hailstorm and lightning** may damage weak structures (electric poles, bill boards, solar panels etc.) during the forecast period.
- **Hailstorm/windstorm** may damage standing crops in the province.
- Day time **temperatures** are likely to decrease during the forecast period.

It is therefore requested to kindly take all precautionary measures in order to avoid/ minimize human losses and/or any damages to infrastructure and livestock. Furthermore, all concerned authorities are requested to take the following safety measures:

- a) Local administrations to assess and plan deployment of additional resources and exercise control over traffic leading to and in vicinity of vulnerable/ choke points/ tourist spots/ attractions and securing (by physical means and keeping people away) from loose structure such as buildings under constructions, advertisement hoardings, electric poles, solar panels etc. to prevent losses/damages and save precious lives.
- b) Main/ linked roads shall be kept clear and open.
- c) Uninterrupted water supply shall be ensured.
- d) Ensure sufficient quantity of daily food and other commodities.
- e) Petrol pumps shall be kept functional with sufficient fuel availability for public;
- f) Advice concerned with keeping monitoring on Rivers, Streams, Local/ Barsati Nullahs.
- g) Tourists are advised to remain extra cautious and avoid unnecessary travel during the forecast period.
- h) Ensure timely mobilization of Rescue 1122 teams where response is required to passengers or other local communities during travelling.
- i) Ensure that drainage systems are clear of debris and obstacles to facilitate the efficient flow of water and minimize the risk of urban flooding.
- j) Coordinates with relevant municipal administrations to ensure mitigation & preparedness measures for landslides/ urban flooding and to secure or remove billboards/ hoardings because of wind/ thunderstorm.
- k) Farmers to be advised to take all necessary mitigative and precautionary measures to safeguard their crops, i.e., timely harvesting, safe storage, or any other precaution from adverse effects of wind/ thunderstorm.



- l) Cattle/ sheep herders to be advised to undertake necessary mitigative and precautionary measures to protect their livestock, i.e., safe sheltering or any other precaution from adverse effects of wind/ thunderstorm.
- m) Travelers on Provincial & National Highways in at-risk / affected areas be forewarned of adverse conditions and detoured to safe waiting areas under the guidance of respective local authorities, national highway & motorway police, LEAs, etc.
- n) The general public is advised to seek shelter in safe areas such as sturdy buildings or underground structures during wind/ thunderstorm, and avoid objects that pose a risk of failing or being struck by lightning.
- o) Ensure availability of emergency services personnel and equipment in areas at high risk of urban flooding, flash flooding and landslides.
- p) Ensure immediate stocking of basic commodities, including paramedics & medicine, especially in regions that are likely to get cut off during landslides.
- q) Ensure widespread circulation of alerts and advisories, especially in local languages, to raise awareness and sensitize travelers/tourists and local communities in at-risk/ vulnerable areas.
- r) Travelers/tourists are advised to: -
 - Plan travels to picnic and tourist spots, considering weather and traffic conditions.
 - Avoid overcrowding picnic and tourist spots and ensure personal safety.
 - Properly dispose of garbage at designated areas to prevent clogging of drainage systems.
 - Keep children away from rivers/ nullahs/ pot holes/ drainage lines to avoid accidents.
 - Carry sufficient drinking water, food supplies, medicines, and power banks, as prolonged road blockage and delays are possible due to landslides.
 - Maintain safe distance (minimum 20 feet) from rivers, streams, and nullahs, as sudden water rise may occur.
 - Avoid walking or driving through flooded areas — just 6 inches of moving water can knock you off your feet.
 - Avoid trekking, hiking, or camping during heavy rains — the risk of landslides, slippery trails, and flash floods increases.
 - Avoid self-driving in unfamiliar or hilly areas during rain — opt for local drivers who know the terrain.
 - Do not attempt to cross bridges or roads submerged in water — they may be damaged or unstable.
 - Cooperate with locals and district authorities, rescue agencies during emergencies or weather disruptions.
- s) Ensure a proactive approach by diverting traffic, providing alternate routes, imposing movement/travel restrictions, to avert any situation of road closure with stranded travelers in light of forecasted weather.
- t) Ensure round-the-clock monitoring of the situation through Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs).
