**Subject: HEATWAVE CONDITIONS PREDICTED IN THE PROVINCE DURING EID HOLIDAYS**

Dear Sir,

I am directed to refer to the subject noted above and to state that Pakistan Meteorological Department, Regional Weather Forecasting Centre, Peshawar has intimated that a high pressure is likely to develop in upper atmosphere on 25<sup>th</sup> May and likely to strengthen on 26<sup>th</sup> May. **Moderate to severe heatwave conditions are likely to develop over the province from 25<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> May.**

**Under the influence of this meteorological condition:**

- Maximum temperature is likely to remain **4 – 6°C** above normal and may rise to **(47 – 50) °C** in DI Khan, Tank, Bannu, Karak & Lakki Marwat.
- Maximum temperature is likely to remain **5 – 7°C** above normal and may rise to **(42 – 45) °C** in Peshawar, Swabi, Nowshera, Charsadda, Mardan, Haripur, Mohmand, Bajaur, Khyber, Hangu, North Waziristan & Kohat.
- Maximum temperature is likely to remain **5 – 7°C** above normal and may rise to **(38 – 40) °C** in Chitral (Upper & Lower), Dir (Upper & Lower), Swat, Shangla, Buner, Malakand, Abbottabad, Kohistan (Upper & Lower), Kolai Pallas, Battagram, Torghar, Mansehra. Orakzai, Kurram & South Waziristan (Upper & Lower).

It is therefore requested to kindly take all precautionary measures to avoid any loss of life, damages to crops and livestock. Furthermore, all concerned authorities are requested to take the following safety measures:

- a. Launch awareness campaigns to inform the public about developing heatwave- like conditions:
  1. Ensure that general public, especially senior citizens and children, are aware of the situation and avoid direct exposure to sunlight during peak hours between 1000 – 1700 hours.
  2. Ensure that general public is made aware to make judicious use of water for drinking and cooling-off.
  3. Encourage individuals with underlying health conditions to remain especially vigilant and ensure they have necessary medical supplies readily available.
  4. Promote the use of appropriate protective measures, such as lightweight, loose-fitting and light-colored clothing, along with SPF and hats.
  5. Educate the public about the signs and symptoms of heat-related illnesses (i.e.,

dehydration, heat exhaustion, heatstroke) and necessary steps to take when experiencing these symptoms.

6. Provide information and encourage utilization of nearby heatstroke centers and cooling centers.
- b. Health Department in coordination with Local Administration to mobilize resources to establish heatstroke centers, cooling points, and mobile cooling stations at high-traffic areas:
  1. Ensure the facilities are equipped with adequate cooling equipment (air conditioners, fans, misting systems) and drinking water.
  2. Have trained personnel available to provide immediate medical assistance if needed.
- c. Farmers are advised to manage their crop activities (wheat harvesting) keeping in view the weather conditions and take care of their livestock as well.
- d. Emergency Services (Rescue 1122/ Fire Brigades) to remain alert against possible fires and undertake preventative measures against fires where possible.
- e. In case of any occurrence, updates may kindly be shared with PEOC, PDMA i.e., active round the clock via toll free helpline 1700.
